TRAVELLING ON RT 18

ON RT 18-FOLLOW PROMPTS OF OVERHEAD DOT READERBOARDS FOR PROPER EXIT

Before 7:15 Take Livingston/ RAC exit/Davidson Rd. Exit

FROM THE SOUTH Turn LEFT onto Davidson Rd. FROM THE NORTH
Turn LEFT onto Davidson Rd.

-Travel ½ mile and turn LEFT onto Bartholomew Rd.

-Travel 4/10 mile and turn RIGHT onto Brett Rd (Park in lots behind Werblin Rec Center)

From 7:15-8:00 Take Busch/ Stadium exit

-Ramp will put you onto Campus Rd

-Travel 2/10 mile and turn LEFT onto Sutphen Rd

-You will be waved RIGHT into lot behind Student center or STRAIGHT to Fitch Rd for parking in Lacrosse Field lots.

After 8:00 Take River Rd. exit

-Turn RIGHT onto River Rd.

-Travel 6/10 mile and turn RIGHT onto Sutphen Rd.

-You will be waved LEFT for parking in Lacrosse Field lots or RIGHT for parking in RU Stadium lot.

TO FINISH/ COLLEGE AVE CAMPUS PARKING
